

Herbs with a monopetalous flower, with seed-bearing vessels divided into three or several partitions have compartments that are

I. Tri-part, with seeds in each hollow

A) paired and larger; with a flower with a bell-shaped entire margin, with a seed-bearing vessel positioned over the bottom of the calices; a large number of these climb and produce milk; eg – CONVULVULUS

B) numerous, short, shiny, milk producing and upright varieties, with a flower

1) resembling a bell, with the margins cut into five divisions at the most, and with a flower and its calyx sitting on a seed-bearing vessel, with vessels

a) oblong and drawn out into pods; eg – SPECULUM

*veneris*

b) shorter and more fleshy, with leaves

1) hairy; eg – TRACHELIUM

2) smooth; eg – CAMPANULA

2) horned, with several flowers closely packed as if it were a whole flower; eg – RAPUNCULUS CORNICULATUS

II. With four partitions, large, spiny, with a basket-like flower out of a long tube; eg – STRAMONIUM

III. Divided into seven partitions, somewhat larger: with a flower semi-cylindrical, or horned brought forth with a lip in the shape of a spade; eg – ARISTOLOCHIA
